SUBJECT: Compliance with the Federal Reduction of Lead in Drinking Water Act

DATE: January 7, 2014

By now you have likely heard a great deal about the Federal Reduction of Lead in Drinking Water Act that went into effect January 4, 2014. The law requires that any valve, fitting, or fixture coming in contact with potable water intended for human consumption must have a weighted average lead content of less than 0.25%.

Morris Group International is prepared to comply with this new federal law. We have been working on lead free products since 2009, when a team was put together to investigate compliance with the California and Vermont Low Lead Laws.

Though the new Federal law permits self-compliance, we felt it was important to have third-party certification. As such, our products are tested for compliance to this new law through IAPMO. Many items are specifically mentioned in the new standard, but we went further to include numerous products throughout the divisions of Morris Group International that are not called out in the standard.

The following products were already in compliance with the Federal Reduction of Lead in Drinking Water Act in advance of the national implementation date of January 4, 2014:


- Acorn Engineering's
 - Drinking fountains; water coolers; bottle fillers;
 - Combination toilets/lavatories; lavatories;
 - Air Control valves;
 - Wash fountains;
- Whitehall Manufacturing's Care-Ware Patient Care Units;
- Murdock Manufacturing's drinking fountains and hydrants;
- Acorn Controls (including the shower valve);
- Chronomite heaters and flow controls; and
- Jay R. Smith Mfg. Co.'s water hammer arresters, trap primers and some wall hydrants.
